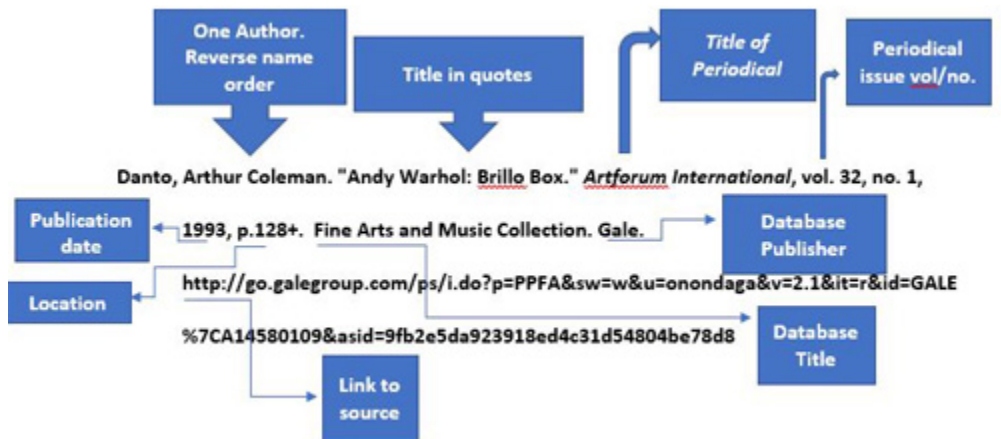
Website

Website No Author:
 When possible list the author, if there is no author listed; it is ok to omit the author from the citation.



Database

Database article: It's necessary to show the path in which one retrieves the article so that the reader can reproduce the search.



YouTube Video

YouTube video:
 The original video was created by HBO, but the writer found the source on YouTube. So both websites need to be listed.



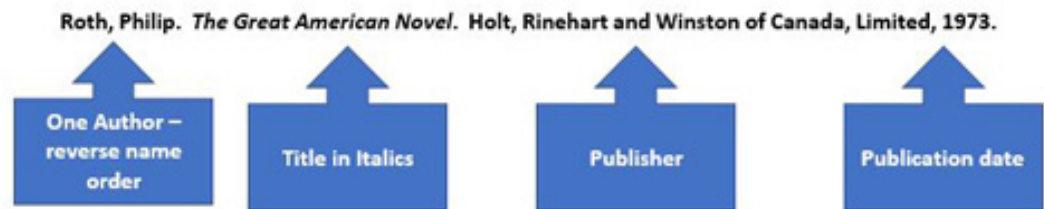
BLOG

Blog: A blog post can be published on many websites. The writer needs to cite the path h/she took to find the source.



BOOK

Book: The number of contributors or authors make a difference in how to format the citation. Please look online to find directions for more than one author.



PERIODICAL

Periodical: The title of the article/source is in quotes; the title of the journal is italicized.
